

**MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
ADVANCE STANDING CREDIT**

**CRIMINAL JUSTICE TECHNOLOGY or
CRIME SCENE TECHNOLOGY**

Brevard Community College (BCC) will award postsecondary advance standing credit to high school students who have completed the Brevard County High School Criminal Justice Operation program number 8918000. *The student will not be charged tuition or fees for the postsecondary credit awarded through this advance standing credit agreement.* Listed below are the sequences of courses that must be completed at the secondary level:

8918020	Criminal Justice Operations 2	1
8918030	Criminal Justice Operations 3	1

BCC will award advance standing credit for the following courses toward the BCC Criminal Justice Technology or Crime Scene Technology Associate in Science degrees:

Course Number	Course Name	Credits
CJT 1112	Crime Scene Safety	3
CJT 1110	Introduction to Crime Scene Technology	3
CCJ 2022	Critical Issues in Criminal Justice	3
CJD 2301	Ethics in Criminal Justice	3

The procedure for obtaining the advance standing credit will be in accordance with these guidelines:

1. Student must meet the following criteria:
 - Cumulative grade point average of 3.0 in the Brevard County High School Criminal Justice Operations program.
 - High School Graduation or GED
 - After graduation, enroll and successfully complete the course sequence below at BCC with a grade of "C" or better:

CJT 1111 Advanced Crime Scene Technology
CCJ 1010 Criminology
CCJ 1020 American Criminal Justice System

Note: If the above courses are taken as dual enrollment, then the courses listed below in the BCC Crime Scene Technology or Criminal Justice Technology AS degrees are recommended course sequences. Students should consult with a BCC advisor for proper course sequencing and planning.

AS Crime Scene Technology or AAS Criminal Justice Technology
CJT 1141 Introduction to Forensic Science
CGS 2100 Microcomputer Applications
CJL 1400 Criminal Procedures
CCJ 2650 Drugs Alcohol and Crime
General Education course in communications or speech (pending proper placement test score)

2. Following completion of required credits at BCC, students must petition the Registrar to have advance standing credit placed on their permanent record. Credit will be awarded with the grade of "S" which will not affect the GPA.

3. The student must enroll in the appropriate BCC courses or program no later than three years after the last high school attendance.

Questions regarding this agreement should be addressed to the Workforce Program Director, Brevard Community College, and/or Director, Career and Technical Education, Brevard Public Schools.

This Memorandum of Understanding shall be effective upon the signature of the district superintendent or his designee and the community college president or his designee. This agreement shall remain in effect until modified or terminated by either party upon thirty (30) days written notice prior to the end of a term or by mutual consent.
