**ARTICULATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN
JOHNSON & WALES UNIVERSITY
AND
MELBOURNE HIGH SCHOOL
Melbourne, FL**

This document defines the conditions of the Culinary Arts Tech Prep Articulation Agreement between Melbourne High School and Johnson & Wales University. Students who qualify under the conditions of this agreement receive transfer credits towards a Culinary Arts Associate's Degree.

Stipulations of the Agreement:

- Students are expected to complete the required admissions application form and must submit an official high school transcript. Upon acceptance to Johnson & Wales University, a student will be eligible for consideration of the articulation agreement.
- Students must forward a letter of recommendation from their Culinary Arts instructor.
- Students must have completed the three-year Culinary Arts program to earn credit at Johnson & Wales University towards a Culinary Arts Associate's Degree.
- Students must earn an overall "C" average in high school and a "B" average in their Commercial Foods program.

Students who submit a sanitation certificate from the National Restaurant Association, The National Registry of Food Safety Professionals or Thomsen Prometric with their admissions application will be exempt from Johnson & Wales' FSM1065 (Sanitation Management).

Students who elect to enter the Hotel & Lodging Management, International Hotel & Tourism Management or Restaurant, Food & Beverage Management degree programs may also earn the transfer credits listed below:

This agreement will be evaluated and reviewed in two years by the Coordinator of Articulation Agreements. If any curriculum changes occur at Johnson & Wales University or Melbourne High School, these changes must be communicated to allow for appropriate modifications to the agreement.

Both Johnson & Wales University and Melbourne High School reserve the right to withdraw from the agreement by submitting written notice of intent at least six (6) months prior to the start of the academic year.


This agreement shall become effective immediately with the graduating class of 2011. Students should discuss their choice of campus with a Johnson & Wales Admissions Representative.
